6. The officer will be expected to:


Serve as primary advisors to commands on relevance and impact of ethics in matters of statecraft, to include public policy, international relations and geopolitical affairs.

  - a. Serve as primary advisors on the impact of religious and cultural differences on ethics, morals, and law.
  - b. Serve as primary advisors in the areas involving moral and ethical decisions which influence core values, organizational climate, standards of conduct.
  - c. Provide a command with recommendations for dealing with such issues as conduct of war, operational missions and plans, conscientious objection, war and religion, and biomedical technologies and treatments.
  - d. Research the ethical implications of emerging technologies and strategies.

e. Serve as primary advisor on the development, delivery, and evaluation of core values and character training.

- b. Ethical implications of religion in society
- c. Biomedical ethics
- d. Just War theory
- e. Moral theory
- f. Values development
- g. Group dynamics and institutional values
